1. _____ (noun): A strong feeling that something is true and real, or good and right.
2. _____ (pl noun): The rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality.
3. _____ (noun): unfair treatment of someone because of their religion, race, or other personal features. As verb--"discriminate"--it can mean to treat someone unfairly, just to be able to notice small differences between things.
4. _____ (noun): A sense of strict honesty and right and wrong. Someone who has this always does what's right even no one is watching.
5. _____ (adj or noun): having to do with your sense of right and wrong. When describe something as "moral," we are saying it's good and right. When something is described as "immoral," it is wrong and evil. Your morals (as a noun) are your rules of right and wrong.
6. _____ (noun): something you feel you **must** do for moral or legal reasons.
7. _____ (noun): why someone does something; the driving force behind someone's decisions and actions.
8. _____ (noun): when an power or authority treats the people under their control cruelly and unfairly in an attempt to keep those people down.
9. _____ (noun): people in general living together in organized communities, with laws and traditions controlling the way that they behave toward one another.
10. _____ (noun): A principle, standard or quality considered worthwhile or desirable.
