LESSON 23 NECESSITIES AND EXTRAS



Dictionaries tell us that a necessity is an absolute requirement, while an extra goes beyond the usual or the expected. A necessity, then, is a basic, and an extra is something additional. It is not always possible to make clear-cut distinctions between the two categories, however. Food, clothing, and shelter are obvious necessities, but beyond that, people's needs and choices vary. The question of necessities and extras is an interesting one, and it has no definite answers. You may like to think about the idea as you study the vocabulary words in this lesson.
